Beware

Matthew 16:12, Then understood they how that he bade them not beware of the leaven of bread, but of the doctrine of the Pharisees and of the Sadducees.

Mark 12:38 And he said unto them in his doctrine, Beware of the scribes, which love to go in long clothing, and love salutations in the marketplaces

Luke 12:15 And he said unto them, Take heed, and beware of covetous- ness: for a man's life consist not in the abundance of the things which he possesses.

II Peter 3:17 Ye therefore, beloved, seeing ye know these things before, beware lest ye also, being led away with the error of the wicked, fall from your own steadfastness.

In each of the four passages above, there is a different matter that we ought to beware of. The word "beware" means to be "cautious, or vigilant." (Webster Handy College Dictionary)

Perhaps, we are apt to be overly cautious relative to certain things, while being less caution or suspicions of others--which are really as/or perhaps even more important. I see that some people are cautious about accepting certain "sound doctrines" than they are listening to and heeding things that are not scriptural.

- 1. We ought to beware of doctrines that did not come from God. Galatians 1:8 "But though we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel unto you than that which we have preached unto you, let him be accursed."
- 2. We ought to beware of those who would go to great length to display their religious piety in public, but show their ungodliness in private! Matthew 7:15 "Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves". Is that still something to be cautious about? I believe it is.

Acts 20:29-30, "For I know this, that after my departing shall grievous wolves enter in among you, not sparing the flock.³⁰ Also of your own selves shall men arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away disciples after them". We have been warned, are we aware and understand that such did happen, as stated, and that we have the results among us today? However, do we observe that such is happening among some of God's people today? We should be and keep ourselves from being taken in by such.

- 3. According to the Lord we should beware of covetousness. Being overly concerned with riches is hurtful, "But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition." (I Tim.6:9) Let us understand that riches in and of itself is not the problem. It is one's attitude toward it and the improper use of such that is the problem.
- 4. According to the inspired apostle Peter, we should beware of the fact that even though we know better, that we may still fall from our own steadfastness! In other word, knowing is not enough! Knowing is essential but it will not keep one safe, if he/she does not take action that is directed by God in the Holy Scriptures.

Beloved, we have been given the ability, with God's provision to come to the knowledge of what is right and wrong, and to keep ourselves pure by walking in the light of God's revelation. However, we are not forced to do so. But the consequences of departing from the revealed and approved path are plainly stated. We make the choice of being wise in our own consent or taking the teaching at heart. There is an active creature there who would help us all that is necessary to persuade us to deny the need to say with God's word. He was effective with Eve, the first woman and man, in the garden, and has a long track record. Let us not be taken in by his deceitfulness.
